MUSIC FESTIVAL MARCHES ON

>> Make Music Winter, an outdoor participatory festival that started in New York City in 2011, is set to expand nationwide to more than 30 U.S. cities this year. New destinations include Anchorage, Alaska; Fort Lauderdale, Florida; Pittsburgh; San Diego; and Spokane, Washington.

The celebration occurs on the winter solstice, Dec. 21, turning the shortest day of the year into one of the most fun. Participants take to the streets to sing, dance and play instruments, making and sharing music of all kinds. Hosts in each city organize their own meeting places and events. For instance, in New York City, an Appalachia-themed dance-



and-fiddle parade called Flatfoot Flatbush travels down Flatbush Avenue beginning at sunset. Los Angeles is hosting Bell by Bell, a parade in which conductors wave color-coded flags instructing participants when to play.

Make Music Winter is the cold-weather counterpart to Make Music Day, which is a global event celebrated in more than 120 countries on June 21, the summer solstice.
